Resource Person: Prof.(Dr.) N. N Sharma (Principal)

Topic: Personality Development and Communication Skill-A Change and

Challenges.

Day II (17-07-2018) (Evening Session)

Resource Person: Prof. Neeru Thakur Topic: Role of Youth in Nation Building.



Prof. Neeru Thakur in her effective presentation ignited the minds of the youth of the college and shared the role and importance of youth in nation building. She said that the young generation shoulders a huge chunk of the responsibility of nation building; not the politicians or the policy makers alone. It would be more accurate to say that the youth working in tandem with the government decide the fate of a nation and its coming generations. It is, therefore, important that the voices of the youth get the right platform. It is necessary that the youth gets to exercise their freedom of speech, their opinion and their ideas. She further discussed that the foundation of an entire nation, its economy and consequently its future depends on how well the youth is educated. The constitution of India guarantees compulsory and free education to every child till the age of 14. But, it is hardly a reality owing to practical hurdles like economic inequality and rising population.

Day III (18-07-2018) (Morning Session)

Topic: Drug Addiction- A threat to Youth.



Sh. Neeraj Rana a most dynamic police officer deliberated on Drug Addiction and shared that we have been experiencing an alarming increase of drug abuse among the youngsters in recent years. Every now and then we read in the newspapers that teens are being held for consuming drugs and most of them are usually aged between 13-18. But the main question arises that why the Indian society is experiencing such a dilemma where more of the teenagers and youths are involved in unethical and unproductive activities like substance or drug abuse.

He was more concerned about the youths and many college-going boys and girls were hauled up by the police involved in the case of drug consumption in a rave party. The alarming rate of drug abuse has always been a problem and especially the increase of drug abuse among youngsters has had detrimental effects on the society. He made the students aware about the soft and hard drugs and was found more concerned about the alarming situation and involvement of society. Officer also shared the fast increasing death rate of the innocent youth due to their involvement in drug distribution and consumption.

Day III (18-07-2018) (Evening Session)

Topic: Present Scenario of Education in India.



Prof. Shashi Kumar in his presentation on the topic Present Scenario of Education in India stressed on various problems and prospects in the present scenario of education in India. He showed his main concern about the low level of education among the poor and the downtrodden, makes the vulnerable to economic and political exploitation. Though adequate provisions had been made in the constitution, to ensure their empowerment and participation. This problem can only be addressed by enlightening masses, by imparting proper education. Thus enabling them to distinguish between good bad.

Day IV (19-07-2018) (Morning Session)

Resource Person: Prof. Sanjeev Sharma

Topic: Swachhta Abhiyan-A Gateway to Healthy India.



Prof. Sanjeev Sharma in his thought provoking presentation on Swachhta Abhiyan- A Gateway to Healthy India focused to create a chain of people who can work together and inspire others to clean their surroundings, presents a creative and collaborative platform where participants will upload of their efforts to clean a particular location.

Day IV (19-07-2018) (Evening Session)

Resource Person: Prof. Sonika

Topic: Role of Economy in Employment Generation.



Prof. Sonika from Department of Economics shared her views on the topic Role of Economy in Employment Generation and presented that the unemployment in developing countries like India is of quite different nature. The main cause of unemployment and underemployment prevailing in the developing countries such as India is deficiency of the stock of physical capital with which to employ the growing labour force. Due to the lack of physical capital, it has not been possible to absorb the growing labour force in productive employment.

She further said that apart from the relative low rate of capital formation as compared to the growth in labour force, the use of capital-intensive techniques in the industries mostly imported from the Western developed countries is another important factor causing unemployment in developing countries like India.

She added that in agriculture, despite the existence of surplus labour reckless mechanization of various agricultural operations has reduced the employment opportunities in agriculture. Another important reason of rural unemployment prevailing in the developing countries like India is extremely unequal distribution of land so that many agricultural households have no adequate access to land for production and self-employment in agriculture. She also focused on the change in mind set of people from wage employment to self-employment.
