Day I (01/09/2021) First Session

Resource Person: Mrs. Neeru Thakur, Principal (Offi.).

Topic: "VidyaDadatiVinayam"



Fourth Induction-cum-orientation Programme organized in GDC Jawali, Distt. Kangra was inaugurated by Mrs. Neeru Thakur, Principal(Offi.). She congratulated all the students who joined this institute with a purpose to achieve their UG degree. She suggested that education shapes one's personality and brings out best in a person which helps one to find one's path to be taken for future life. She quoted saying by a Sanskrit scholar, "**Vidya Dadati Vinayam**" and elaborated that as outcome of your learning your understanding the way of life changes and you become more humble and accept all life situations with grace. She further suggested that education helps us to develop our skills, enhances our knowledge and gives us strength to face the real life situations effectively. She showed confidence in them and wished them good luck .

Day I (01/09/2021) Second Session

Resource Person: Mr. Nishant Narang, (Assistant Prof. in Commerce).

Topic: " New Education Policy-2020 and CBCS RUSA System."



Mr. Nishant Narang shared his views on NEP-2020 that how education will its practical aspect inclusion.e. skill enhancement is going to make a huge difference in learning process. He compared the present RUSA Credit score system with the NEP-2020. He explained that with the implementation of NEP-2020 students who by one or the other reason have to quit studies and go to earn their livelihood will get a chance to complete their Degree as this system will provide multiple entry and multiple exit opportunities to the learner. Credits earned will be kept secured in **Credit Bank** so that one can start from where he /she has left his/her studies.

He suggested that in present system of CBCS RUSA although credit points are in same manner but flexibility as in NEP-2020 is not there. He suggested that all the students should opt their subjects with utmost care and futuristic approach. He explained with the help of chart provided in the CBCS RUSA plan how to calculate 132 credit score for UG Three Year Degree (Pass Course).



## Day II (02/09/2021) First Session

Resource Person: Mr. Ashwani Sharma (Associate Prof. in English).

Topic: " Importance of Disciplined Life "



Mr. Ashwani Sharma started his interaction with students by a simple question that "What do you understand by the word Discipline?" Student's answer included words as "orderliness", "efficiency", "punctuality", "organization", "focus on one's task" etc. After getting such answers he appreciated their varied responses and suggested that all these are various traits of an individual's character which helps one to complete the task in a particular given time. He emphasized that discipline is a concept which everyone is aware of but very few practice it on daily basis. By sharing life experience and success stories of good leaders he emphasized that all great leaders, followed disciplined path to achieve success in life.

He suggested that people who are disciplined are more focused both mentally and physically. They are better able to align their body and mind with their ideas and goals. This helps to develop self-control, the ability to avoid unhealthy excess of anything that could lead to negative consequences. He concluded the session with the thought that discipline helps to address individual problems and develop a society that is both peaceful and respectful. Therefore, it would be right to say that without discipline there is no life at all.

**Resource Person: Mr. Sulakshan Kumar (Associate Prof. in History).**

**Topic: "AzadikaAmrutMahotsav"**



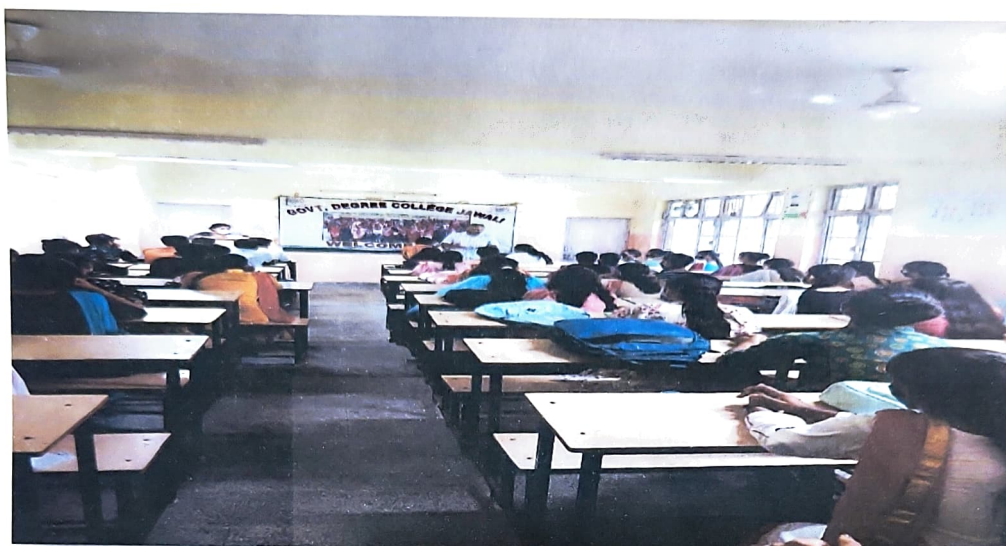
Mr. Sulakshan Kumar introduced his topic with the query on which day we celebrate Independence day? Answer is very simple on 15<sup>th</sup> of August every year since 1947. He related that "AzadikaAmrutMahotsav" is an initiative of the Government of India to celebrate and commemorate 75 years of progressive India and the glorious history of its people, culture and achievements. He elaborated the facts that this Mahotsav is dedicated to the people of India who have not only been instrumental in bringing India thus far in its evolutionary journey but also hold within them the power and potential to build Atmanirbhar Bharat. Thus AzadikaAmrutMahotsav is an embodiment of all that is progressive about India's socio-cultural, political and economic identity. The official journey of "AzadikaAmrutMahotsav" commences on 12<sup>th</sup> March, 2021 which starts a 75 week countdown to our 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of independence and will conclude on 15<sup>th</sup> August, 2023. As convener of cultural committee he suggested that various co-curricular activities will be organized in college as a part of this celebration and all those interested can participate as per their area of interest.



### Day III (03/09/2021) First Session

Resource Person: Ms. Sonika (Associate Prof. in Economics).

Topic: " Women Empowerment"



Ms. Sonika started her interaction with Pt. Jawahar Lal Nehru's quote

" To awaken the people, it is the women who must be awakened. Once she is on the move the family moves, the villages moves, the nation moves."

She explained in detail that although India's journey towards women empowerment has its share of highs and lows but its historical perspective gives us the real insight of path already covered and challenges still in front of us. Some important facts shared and explained by her namely –

- 26/01/1950 when Indian constitution was adopted , its Articles 14 to 10 gives Equal rights to men and women as citizen of India.
- Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961.
- Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005.
- The government increased Maternity leave from 12 weeks to 26 weeks under Maternity Benefit Act in 2017 for private sector.
- The women's Reservation Bill gives 33 percent reservation for women seats in all levels of Indian politics. An attempt to increase female political participation. The bill was first introduced on 12/09/1996 by the Deve Gowda government . Successive governments tried to push for the bill but it took 14 years to get it passed in the Rajya Sabha . The Bill has yet to be passed in the Lok Sabha and in all State legislative assemblies.
- Women in India are emerging in all sectors, including politics, business, medicine , sports, agriculture, space scientists, research, defense services i.e. in every walk of life.
- India's story to women empowerment is not complete without focusing on grassroots levels . some initiatives by government namely BETI BACHAO BETI PADHAO, PRADHAN MANTRI UJJWALA YOJANA, MAHILA-E-HAAT

She concluded her interaction with a hope that women at all levels whether rural or urban will enjoy the access to health care, education, employment and decision making.
