1. Introduction:-

Govt. Degree College, Jawali, is a constituent college of Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla. This college was established in May, 2018 vide H.P. Govt. Notification No. EDN-A_Ka(1)-32-2007-Loose , dated 14-05-2018. At present the classes in Arts & Commerce streams are running in the college with total student strength of 350, out of which 82% are girl students. This college provides the opportunity of higher education at the doorstep to the students of Jawali and its surrounding areas. Presently this college is running in the additional building of Government Senior Secondary School Jawali.

Our college strives to create an environment conducive to continuous academic, co-curricular activities and holistic development of students as well as staff members. For this purpose, consistent efforts are made by all stakeholders to foster, encourage and motivate ideas and put them into practice. College tries to inculcate all the values enshrined in our constitution i.e. value of liberty, equality, justice and brotherhood. We encourage a sense of tolerance for different cultures and opinions among our students.

With the purpose of consistently improving and innovating the teaching learning process and chasing our aim to make it students centric, we emphasize on best practices and quality learning. Students are encouraged to reflect upon interpreting meaningful social issues concerning the society with a view to have a better interaction with community and to promote involvement and participation through social awareness programs like: NSS, NCC, Eco Club, Red Ribbon Club, Rovers & Rangers, Road safety club, Women Grievance & Redressal Cell, Energy Club, Electoral literacy Club, YUVA tourism Club and Cyber Jagrookta Club etc.

In order to have its own building, a new land site comprising of 3.2232 hectare (about 83 Kanals) has been identified. The college building is proposed to be constructed in 3.2232 hectare (about 83 kanals) of land, out of which 2.2882 hectare (about 60 Kanals) is forest land and 0.9350 hectare (about 24 kanals) is govt. land. The proposal for diversion of forest land (online proposal no. FP/HP/SCH/454129/2023, dated 06-12-2023) for FCA clearance has been submitted to the concerned departments. The Ministry of Environment Forest and Climate Change, regional office, Chandigarh (Sub-office Shimla) Himachal Pradesh, vide letter no. Online proposal no.: FP/HP/SCH/454129/2023, Dated 23/11/2025 has granted In-principle approval of FCA case (Stage-I) for construction of college building. With consistent effort, directions and guidance of Prof. Chander Kumar Ji, Hon'ble cabinet minister of Agriculture & Animal Husbandry, govt. has approved/provided additionality amounting to Rs 155.79 lakhs to pay compensatory levies bill for stage-II/final FCA clearance. Permission has also granted by govt. to transfer 0.9350 hectare (about 24 kanals) of non-forest/govt. land in the name of education deptt. Directorate of higher education, Shimla has also approved the layout plan & sketch drawings for construction of college building. We are hopeful to get final FCA clearance (Stage-II) at the earliest so as to start the construction work of college building in minimum possible time.

2. Staff Position: There are 08 sanctioned posts of teachers out of which 02 are lying vacant, 11 sanctioned posts of non - teaching staff out of which 03 are lying vacant.

9. Development Activities:

In the session 2025-26, the following development activities have been undertaken for the welfare of students and the institution:

1. In order to perform cultural items during various activities in the college, 10 dresses (Sarees) have been purchased for girl students of the college out of the fund provided by Prof. Chander Kumar Ji, Hon'ble cabinet minister of agriculture and animal husbandry.
2. In order to improve the sports activities in the college campus one set of weightlifting platform has been installed in the college. The weightlifting set has been provided by DHE, Shimla under "Khel Se Swasthya Yojna 2023-24" of H.P. Govt.

3. Keeping in view the medical emergency/need of physically handicapped students one wheelchair and portable/folding stretcher have been purchased from the fund donated by the family of late Prof. Ashwani Sharma.
4. In order to improve the learning experience of students the college library has been upgraded by installation of four 3-seater library reading tables. The fund donated by the family of late Prof. Ashwani Sharma has been used for this purpose.
5. Keeping in view the health and hygiene of girl students one sanitary napkin incinerator machine has been installed in girls washroom. This machine is provided/donated by Sh. Umesh Dhiman Ji, BDC member from Dhan-Pharian under Nagrota Surian block.
6. In order to help poor and needy students magazines have been purchased for college library and 250 books have been made available with the help of DHE, Shimla.
7. In order to make proper/comfortable seating arrangement chairs have been purchased for the college library.
8. The college computer lab has been upgraded by installation/upgradation/replacement of software and other related hardware devices. In addition to this the furniture (chairs) installed in the computer lab have also been repaired so as to make it more comfortable to students.
9. In order to provide healthy and hygienic environment the repairs/installation works have been undertaken in washrooms of students/staff/office.

10. Scholarships: (Nodal Officer: Prof. Sulakshan Kumar, Member : Dr. Madhu)

The Scholarship Committee of Government Degree College Jawali for the session 2025–26 has actively worked to create awareness among students about various central and state government scholarship schemes. The committee aims to guide students in availing financial assistance for their education, ensuring that they complete necessary procedures such as Aadhar seeding and document submission correctly. Through interactive sessions, live demonstrations, and dedicated guidance, the committee helps students understand scholarship eligibility, application processes, and address their queries, thereby empowering them to access educational opportunities efficiently.

All the applications of these applicants were verified by the institution for further necessary action at the directorate level.

12. Library:
